<u>Comments from the floor:</u> Billie Teller of 5300 Lakeshore Dr. NE Thornville asked about water issues, and she also requested removal of a tree. Tim said he would go out this week and take a look at the situation and get back with her.	
<u>Township Department Reports:</u> Chief Bob Price Millersport Fire Department – Chief Price is in the process of hiring personnel with certificates. MARKS radio brought up to compliance. Thurston Walnut Fire Department – Chief Price is coordinating with both departments to staff both stations and working to complete updating the equipment, truck checks are monitored through the computer system ALDTC. He reported the transition has been relatively smooth and is positive. All SCBA bottles have been brought up to compliance in January, 2020 with an expiration date of May 2021. The cost up updating SCBA harnesses and SCBA bottles is estimated \$74,800.00 plus an additional \$7000.00 for face pieces. The Trustees expressed they are unified in the consolidation of both fire departments and want to move forward with a Township Fire Department.

The Trustees asked Tim about the possibility of signs indicating the area was being surveilled. The Trustees	
agreed that if the fence doesn't work, the bins will be removed.	
Park & Roads - Tim Morris Tornado shelter we placed 2 nd in the State, and Tim says it looks favorable for the township to receive the grant. Tim is applying for additional grants available for road repairs.
